The International Movement ATD Fourth World is a non-governmental organization with no religious or political affiliation which engages with individuals and institutions to find solutions to eradicate extreme poverty. Working in partnership with people in poverty, ATD Fourth World's human rights-based approach focuses on supporting families and individuals through its grass-roots presence and involvement in disadvantaged communities, in both urban and rural areas, creating public awareness of extreme poverty and influencing policies to address it.

Founded in 1957 by Joseph Wresinski, ATD Fourth World works in thirty countries in Africa, Asia, America and Europe in order to:

- → Unite and learn from the experience of people living in extreme poverty
- → Promote access to knowledge, culture and education
- → Create pilot projects to guarantee access to fundamental rights for all
- → Inform and mobilize citizens, civil society, authorities and institutions

- → Investigate and raise awareness of extreme poverty
- → Promote the participation of, and representation for, the most disadvantaged communities with respect to local, national and international agencies.

Full-time volunteers who take up a commitment with ATD Fourth World— often living side by side with very poor communities— all receive the same modest wage regardless of their position or responsibilities, which is ethically consistent with life in the country where they work.

I was a boy who used to go to the street library run by ATD Fourth World in my town, San Jacinto. Passionate about art and creativity I became a teacher and devoted myself to the carrying out of activities with the poorest families in the area, walking for up to two hours to get to some local villages.

In 1994 I was marked by a journey to the town of Guatemala City. I could not imagine that there were families in the capital living in shacks made of sheet metal or cardboard. Five years later I left my teaching job to become a full-time volunteer and to live in the City. It wasn't easy to leave my former way of life and many questioned the depth of my commitment, especially when, in 2002, I left my country for the first time to join the ATD Fourth World team in Peru.

The distance involved and the cultural differences almost led me to go back, but Fourth World families gave me the strength to stay. I understood just how important the presence of fultime volunteers is for these families and the potential for change inherent in the mutual trust we are building together.
